The Event The event shall be a Multi-club Motorkhana, promoted and organised by the Beverley

Offroad Motor Sports Association (BORMSA). All tests will be selected from the Motorkhana test booklet. The event will be held under the International Sporting Code of the FIA and the National Competition Rules (NCR) of the Confederation of Australian Motor Sport Ltd (CAMS), the National Motorkhana Code, the Passenger in Vehicle Guidelines (Non-Speed Events), these Supplementary Regulations and any Further

Regulations authorised by CAMS.

This event will be conducted under and in accordance with the CAMS Risk Management and Occupational Health and Safety Policies. These policies and the

*Number of Entries* Limited to a maximum number of 20 entries.

A maximum of three entries per vehicle will be accepted.

If the number of entries submitted exceeds the maximum number of entries, entries shall be accepted in order of receipt of fully paid entries. The organiser reserves the

right to refuse entry to any competitor in accordance with NCR 83.

Eligibility Drivers must be a member of a CAMS affiliated Car Club. Current Club Membership

Cards must be produced at documentation.

Drivers must possess and produce a 2NSJ (or higher) CAMS Licence at documentation.

The Competitor shall provide written authorisation for the use of the vehicle in competition by the Driver(s) and acceptance of the Terms and Conditions by signing the disclaimer on the reverse of the entry form.

The minimum age for drivers is 12. Juniors (12 - 18 yrs) must have their entry form signed by their parent or their legal guardian.

### **Scrutiny**

The vehicle must pass scrutiny and comply with Schedule A and with Group H Regulations as per the current CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. Scrutiny and documentation will be conducted on Sunday 25<sup>th</sup> May 2008 at BORMSA Motorplex, as per the Schedule below. Cars must be adequately muffled.

Cars shall be presented to scrutineering in a clean condition.

### **Safety**

All drivers shall, while competing, wear at least a lap/sash type seat Belt (unless exempted by registration with CAMS as an Historic Car).

Drivers of motorkhana specials and open top vehicles must wear a helmet complying with AS 1698 or Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motorsport.

Goggles or a helmet with visor (AS1609-1981) must be worn in all open top cars and in closed cars which have the windscreen removed.

### **Apparel**

Neck to wrist to ankle, fire retardant clothing is preferred.

Suitable and appropriate footwear must be worn – footwear which has a leather upper and worn with pure cotton or pure woollen socks is satisfactory. Footwear made of synthetic material, thongs, roman sandals and high heels are not suitable or appropriate.

## **Tests**

4 to 12 tests may be conducted, with up to 3 runs of every test (depending on competitor numbers and light conditions). Fastest times on each test shall be collated to determine results. The observer/timekeeper is deemed Judge of Fact.

<u>Awards</u> This event comprises part of the 2008 BORMSA Junior Motorkhana Club

Championship. Points shall be awarded as 5 points for 1<sup>st</sup> place down to 2 points for

4<sup>th</sup> place. All other participants shall receive one point for competing.

To be eligible for the Club Championship, competitors must be BORMSA members and compete in a 2WD vehicle. To register a result for the Championship, a

competitor must officiate/volunteer at a minimum of one event per year.

<u>Protests</u> Protests, if any, must be lodged in accordance with Part XII of the NCR.

**Postponement** The organiser reserves the right to postpone, abandon or cancel the event in

accordance with NCR 59.

### **Prohibited Substances**

During any event, consumption of alcoholic beverages in the paddock, pits or any other portion of the competition venue under the control of the officials is expressly forbidden until all practice or competition activity is concluded for each day. Any driver or crew member who is found to be affected by alcohol on the day of the event or practice therefore shall not be permitted to participate. Refer NCR 145A of the Current CAMS Manual.

In addition, the persons concerned will be subject to the Articles of the Procedure for Alcohol Testing and CAMS Drugs in Sport Policy. Competitors, crews or officials may be tested for alcohol or other drugs at any time during the event(s). This regulation serves as the required 24-hour notice to Competitors, Crew and Officials.

**Insurance** Refer Appendix I of the current CAMS Manual.
