Entries

- Acceptance Only entries made on the official entry form will be accepted. The official entry form must be completed in full with payment enclosed.
- *Payment* Cheques and/or money orders should be made payable to "Beverley Off Road Motorsports Association" (BORMSA).
- *Cost* \$35.00 per entry received *before* Sunday 23rd September \$45.00 per entry received *on* Sunday 23rd September

- *Number of Entries* Limited to a maximum number of 40 entries.

A maximum of three entries per vehicle will be accepted.

If the number of entries submitted exceeds the maximum number of entries, first priority of acceptance will be given to members of the Beverly Off Road Motor Sports Association (BORMSA), followed by order of receipt of all other fully paid entries.

Eligibility Entrant and Driver must be a member of a CAMS affiliated Car Club. Current Club Membership Cards must be produced at documentation.

Entrant and Driver must possess and produce a 2NSJ (or higher) CAMS Licence at documentation.

The minimum age for drivers is 14. Juniors (14 - 18 yrs) must have their entry form signed by their parent or their legal guardian.

Scrutiny The vehicle must pass scrutiny and comply with Group 4H and Section 6, Schedule A (refer also Schedule J, where applicable) as per the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport. A fire extinguisher of at least 900g complying with Schedule H of the CAMS Manual of Motor Sport must be fitted.

Scrutiny and documentation will be conducted on Sunday 23rd September 2007 at BORMSA Motorplex, as per the Schedule below.

<u>Safety</u> All drivers shall, whilst competing, wear at least a lap/sash type seat belt (unless exempted by registration with CAMS as a Historic Car).

All entrants and instructors must wear a helmet complying with AS 1698 or Schedule D of the current CAMS Manual of Motor sport.

Goggles or a helmet with visor (AS1609-1981) must be worn in all open cars and in closed cars which have the windscreen removed.

Apparel Neck to wrist to ankle, fire retardant clothing must be worn.

Suitable and appropriate footwear must be worn – footwear which has a leather upper and worn with pure cotton or pure woollen socks is satisfactory. Footwear made of synthetic material, thongs, roman sandals and high heels are not suitable or appropriate.

- Tests8 to 24 tests may be conducted, with up to 6 tests running concurrently (depending
on competitor numbers). After competitors have completed the first set of tests, the
courses will be reversed and run again. This procedure will be repeated until the
event concludes.
- **Schedule** Entries Open Sunday 9th September 2007 at 08:00am

A drive-through of stages will be completed prior to the start of competition.

Start of First Test Sunday 23rd September 2007 at 10:15am

ALL Drivers must be present at the Driver's Briefing if they wish to participate in the event.
